## Calendar Year 2014

## (Preliminary Data)

Total Parole Board workload for calendar year 2014 was 13,038 hearings, including 168 administrative hearings for rescission decisions, INS-closed, alternate date considerations, or special considerations. The tables below summarize in detail Parole Board activity for the year.

Table 3 shows that during calendar year 2014, the Board of Parole and the Commissioner of the Department of Corrections and Community Supervision made determinations on 12,870 cases that were eligible for release to parole supervision. This was a decrease of 148 cases (-1.1%) compared to calendar year 2013. Of the 12,870 cases reviewed during 2014, 3,057 (23.8%) were approved for release. This rate of approval was 0.7% lower than calendar year 2013, when 3,192 (24.5%) of the 13,018 reported parole eligible cases were approved for release.

According to Table 4 and Table 5, there were 9,585 Initial appearances reported for calendar year 2014. This was 52 fewer than the 9,637 reported for the same period in 2013. The 24.7% approval rate for Initial hearings during 2014 was down 1.7% from the 26.4% reported in 2013. Initial appearances made up 74.4% of the Parole Board interviews for calendar year 2014 compared to 74.0% of the total Board interview activity during 2013.

The 3,285 Reappearances reported during 2014 were 96 fewer (-2.8%) than the 3,381 reported for 2013. The approval rate for Reappearances during 2014 was 21.0%, compared to 19.0% during 2013, a decrease of 2.0%.
